

The first time I did this, I know I felt very sad. I felt like I had done something wrong. I had sinned. But why? Why was I feeling so upset about it? And the more I thought about it, the sadder I got because I realised I wasnt sad because I no longer had a bible, or because it was as though I had torn up a precious letter from a loved one. Rather I was sad because I had torn up a perfectly good book. I had destroyed something which was still perfectly good. I had wasted the \$19.99 cost of the book.

And this is when I truly cried. I began to realise how blind I was to my own sin. I was upset for all the wrong reasons. I didn't actually care about the bible. I didn't value it as the priceless message of God to my soul. I didn't see how special it was to have God speak to me. I didn't appreciate having God in my life and took Him for granted.

The bible is not just another book. It is the very words of God.

Just think about that for a moment. God cares to speak to us and he says: I love you.
